67 km of idyllic hiking routes surround Innsbruck, the capital of Tirol, enriching your winter city break. In Vienna, a family toboggan session can become part of your itinerary, with local hills and parks transforming into ideal runs. Or get to know the urban environment from a different perspective on a unique city tour, such as to the Spittelberg to learn about its eventful history. The architectural hotspot of Vorarlberg can be explored on individual expeditions and an interactive city guide will lead you through the highlights of Graz city centre.

Ice Skating in Klagenfurt

On Winter Paths Through St. Pölten

St. Pölten, the capital of Lower Austria, amazes with its different architectural styles. The spectrum ranges from baroque buildings to art nouveau houses and the modern structures in the government district. In winter, town hall square and its baroque buildings are the starting point for various city tours and walks. With the "Hearonymus" app, visitors can also explore St. Pölten on their own.

Upper Austria

Marvel at Graffiti in Linz

Linz, the capital of Upper Austria, is home to the largest inland harbour of the Upper Danube. Large warehouses, containers, cranes, and tracks set the scene around the three large water basins. A few years ago, the desire was expressed to brighten up the grey facades of the harbour buildings, giving birth to the idea of "Mural Harbor". The colourful gallery is now home to around 300 large-scale graffitis and murals by artists from 35 nations, which visitors can view on guided tours. The tours take place every Saturday afternoon in winter.

Salzburg Ice Arena

The ice arena in the Volksgarten has 2 circuits of 300 m² and 400 m². They are connected by a 240 m long, 3 m wide ice path. There is also an indoor ice rink.

Tobogganing and Skiing in Bregenz With a View of Lake Constance

Winter sports enthusiasts have plenty of options in Bregenz, the capital of Vorarlberg. Glide down the slopes with a view of Lake Constance and ski all the way to Bregenz when the snow conditions allow on the city's local mountain, the 1,064 m high Pfänder. There is also an attractive toboggan run from the Pfänder to Bregenz, which can be reached with the Pfänderbahn cable car.

Winter Hiking Around Innsbruck

The 17 cleared or prepared paths near the Tirolean capital are 67 km long, with sturdy shoes and warm clothing being all you need to set off on a winter adventure. From the leisurely Mieminger Plateau to the high-alpine landscape of the Sellraintal or with cable car assistance in Oberperfuss: winter hiking gets the heart rate up and opens views of impressive mountain panoramas and romantic scenery. There are also huts to stop and warm up at along the way.

Vienna

Tobogganing in Vienna

Austria's capital has a number of places for mainly short toboggan runs. On the Jesuitenwiese meadow in the Prater, a 60 m long track leads down from the 10 m high hill. Floodlights ensure the fun can continue until 9 pm. There are toboggan hills in 15 parks including the Stadtpark, Schweizergarten, Kurpark Oberlaa, and on the Roter Berg in Hietzing. The toboggan runs from the Satzberg and in the Steinhof recreation area, both in the 14th district, are around 200 m long.

Vienna Tours in Winter

City tours on various topics – from architecture to cuisine – take place all year round in Vienna. Guided tours through Vienna's cemeteries are particularly atmospheric in the cold season. Participants learn more about the famous personalities that have been laid to rest here and the interesting burial rites of the Viennese. The Central Cemetery is especially

impressive as one of the largest cemeteries in Europe. It is home to around 330,000 graves and the small "Cemetery of the Nameless".

Ice Skating in Vienna

Ice skating is one of the most popular winter activities of Vienna's residents and visitors are welcome at the various ice rinks too. High above the city, Vienna's only rooftop ice rink invites you to enjoy a unique experience: the Engelmänn Artificial Ice Rink was founded over 100 years ago as the world's first open-air artificial ice rink. It has been located on the roof of a building in the 17th district since the 1970s.

By day and night, ice skaters glide in front of the magnificent backdrop of City Hall. The approx. 8,300 m² ice surface is divided into squares and paths that wind their way through the romantically lit City Hall Park. Several stalls offer drinks and snacks.

The Wiener Eislaufverein (Viennese ice skating association) near the Stadtpark is a traditional rink with urban charm. It has been attracting figure skaters and ice dancers as well as ice hockey players, freestylers, and curlers with its 6,000 m² ice surface for more than 150 years.

The Wintergarten in the MuseumsQuartier and "ParadEIS" on the Danube Canal are also ideal for curling.
