

Dear readers,

The Austrian "Lebensgefühl" is the reason why guests spend their holidays in Austria. A sense of serenity, ease and enjoyment that you experience when meeting the locals and then take home with you.

Austria also understands the importance of offering its guests something new each time. Thanks to new services you can now hike along the Alpe-Adria-Trail through Carinthia with almost zero emissions, for example. Cyclists draw on their own energy to complete the new Donau-Veltliner circuit in Lower Austria's Weinviertel and the Sebaldus Trails in Upper Austria even make bike pilgrimages possible.

A number of bike parks have launched new trails, such as those in Saalfelden-Leogang in SalzburgerLand or in Brixental and Galtür in Tirol. Adventure trails which – similar to escape rooms – set tasks and require you to solve puzzles via smartphone are adding to the fun in the Tiroler Zugspitz Arena, Villach in Carinthia and Bludenz in Vorarlberg.

The new mountain station on the Dachstein in Styria ticks both boxes in terms of appearance and sustainability. The "Energy Crystal" will open in May 2024.

Relaxed summer days can be spent at the newly designed lidos at Lake Constance and on the shores of Lake Neusiedl in Breitenbrunn. At Lake Millstätter See in Carinthia, a total of three lidos are being updated.

The new meeting place for culture vultures is the TangenteStPölten festival. The Albertina is opening its third location in the former Essl Museum in Klosterneuburg whilst the House of Strauss has opened in Vienna, which will celebrate 200 years of Johann Strauss in 2025. But there are plenty of anniversaries to celebrate this year too: from 950 years of Admont Abbey in Styria to 20 years of the Museum der Moderne in Salzburg and 10 years of Bus:Stop Krumbach in Vorarlberg.

There are numerous new accommodations, from stylish chalets in the wine-growing regions of Burgenland and Styria to resorts by lakes such as the Klopeiner See in Carinthia or the Walchsee in Tirol. Many hosts have modernised their rooms and suites or extended their wellness areas.

We also introduce you to some particularly wonderful personalities. The Carinthian Summer festival is being led by versatile artistic director Nadja Kayali as of late. Lukas Nagl, Gault&Millau Chef of the Year 2023, is cooking up a storm at Lake Traunsee in Upper Austria. Master butcher Hans Walter produces the original Bosna in Salzburg and Styria is home to organic flower farmer Margit de Colle.

Austria's most spectacular highaltitude paths and bike trails cater for the athletic, whilst families discover their happy place between mountain adventures and crystal-clear bathing lakes. And city trips and excursions into the countryside promise to stimulate the mind and delight the palate.

Family time. Mountains of opportunities

Austria's pristine mountains are the perfect place to try out something new and have a great time together. On the high plateau of **Serfaus-Fiss-Ladis** in Tirol, for example, plenty of child-friendly hiking tours, bike park action and Adventure Mountains riddles await. Families that love to cycle feel right at home in the **Tiroler Zugspitz Arena**. In addition to leisurely routes and fast-paced trails there is extensive "gravel" here. Varied holiday programmes for kids and teens also mean that everyone gets some time to themselves. In the neighbouring **Alpbachtal** the mountains are gentler with peaks that even the little ones can climb. In between there are cool forest playgrounds and mysterious gorges to explore. Yes please: dive into Tirol's warmest bathing lakes. In Styria, river valleys, pine forests and lofty heights become a discovery zone. "Take a bike" is the motto in the **Murtal**, whilst exciting themed trails provide fun and adventure in **Murau**.

Summit moments. Personal, authentic, unforgettable

Take a deep breath and gather new strength where earth and sky meet. In the Tirolean **region of Seefeld**, for example, this can be done in the picturesque alpine pastures of the Gaistal or by e-biking to the source of the Isar. Rustic huts and excellent restaurants guarantee tasty treats along the entire high plateau. Those looking for vertical thrills should head to the legendary via ferratas of the **Achensee region**. Tirol's largest lake also offers water sports ranging from swimming to kitesurfing. The Styrian holiday region of **Schladming-Dachstein** impresses with its variety of landscapes too. Mountain lakes, waterfalls and streams invite you to hike by the water – all the way up to the summit of the Dachstein. Award-winning alpine cuisine spoils you along the way. There is literally no end of culinary highs in Tirol's **Zillertal** either. The valley of the "three-thousand-metre peaks" enchants visitors with its top tables, including in the High Alps Nature Park Zillertal Alps. Mountain fans are drawn to the **Montafon** in Vorarlberg too. The "Alpine Mosaic Montafon" leads through fantastic valleys and heights. In the **Bregenzerwald** there are lovely long-distance hiking trails that take the curious to old and new wooden architecture or to fabulous cheeses. And with the "Stoneman Taurista", the hiking paradise **Altenmarkt-Zauchensee** in Salzburg is a tip for real MTB cracks.


City, country, pleasure. Pure joy of life

Austria's unique "Lebensgefühl", serene and well grounded, can also be found on city trips and excursions into the countryside. The **UNESCO World Heritage City of Salzburg**, for example, inspires with plenty of culture and a love of life. Its DomQuartier is celebrating its 10th anniversary and there are festivals to suit all tastes here in the City of Mozart. **Carinthia** inspires with its variety of both leisurely and more challenging (long-distance) cycling routes as well as Austria's warmest bathing lakes. **Klagenfurt** awaits you on Lake Wörthersee with renaissance flair, music festivals and flavoursome Alpe-Adria cuisine. In neighbouring **Southern Styria**, idyllic hiking routes or e-bike tours lead to delicacies such as pumpkin seed oil and Schilcher wine. Open-air photo exhibition NATURAL HERITAGE puts the charming thermal spa town of **Baden bei Wien** on the pulse of time. Further explorations in **Austria's Small Historic Towns** lead to beautiful gardens, beer tastings or imperial flair such as in the salt town of Bad Ischl, the vibrant centre of the European Capital of Culture Salzkammergut in 2024. The motto: "Culture is the new salt".

Alpannonia long-distance hiking trail

The 125 km long Alpannonia long-distance hiking trail leads from Fischbach in Styria through Lower Austria and Burgenland to Köszeg in Hungary. From this summer there will be two new bookable offers for the Burgenland section. The 44 km long Two Castle Tour leads to the castles of Schlaining and Lockenhaus, and the 55 km long Three Castle Tour also takes hikers to Bernstein Castle. The packages include two or three overnight stays with breakfast. You can also book a luggage transfer service.

Hike along the Slow Trail to Lake Meerauge

Carinthia has been developing Slow Trails for some years now, which invite you to embark on leisurely hikes and nature observations by lakes. As of this summer, the 5 km long Slow Trail Meerauge in the Bodental will be adding to the collection. The highlight of the trail with a walking time of about one and a half hours is the "Meerauge" (sea eye), a crystal-clear, shimmering turquoise lake at 1,000 m above sea level which was formed by a glacier during the last ice age.

Hiking without a footprint

Starting this summer, the environmentally aware will be able to hike along the Alpe-Adria-Trail through Carinthia for a week with almost zero emissions. The package is designed for arrival and return journey by train and includes overnight stays in sustainably managed partner establishments with regional and seasonal Alpe-Adria cuisine. Luggage is transported exclusively with electrically powered vehicles and hikers use public transport for local transfers. At the end of the trip, the climate protectors receive a personal climate report with their emissions balance. The "Hiking without a footprint" package can be booked in two variants: either from Hohe Tauern National Park to Lake Millstätter See or from Lake Millstätter See to Bad Kleinkirchheim.

Bee nature trail St. Jakob im Rosental

In autumn 2023, the Maria Elend Beekeeping Association created a bee nature trail. The 5.8 km long trail leads from Greuth to the Carnica beekeeping station on the Maria Elender Alm. Twelve boards provide information about the Carnica bee along the way. The beekeeping association offers guided hikes from the beginning of June to the end of August. The approximately two-and-a-half-hour hike ends at the beekeeping station where participants learn more about the breeding of queen bees and enjoy a traditional "Jause" platter.

Donau-Resonanzweg

Keen walkers will be able to set off along the new Donau-Resonanzweg (Danube Resonance Trail) from April 2024. It is located by Waldkirchen near the Schlögener Schlinge loop of the Danube river and enables hikers to feel the might of the four elements of water, air, fire and earth. The trail runs across meadows and through forests, with stunning views opening up time and again. The Donau-Resonanzweg is designed for all those who want to find balance through a conscious experience of nature and thus learn more about themselves.

Even more comfortable: the Höfe Trail East Tirol

The Höfe Trail in East Tirol, which previously led from farm to farm in five daily stages, each with a length of around 10 km, will have two additional stages from May 2024. These stages will lead hikers to the neighbouring Lesachtal Valley in Carinthia. From mid-May there will also be new offers to simplify hiking adventures, especially for families. There will be bookable packages with two to six overnight stays, some of which include luggage transfer. What's more, there will also be the option of staying at one accommodation and heading to the starting points of the Höfe Trail stages by public transport each day.

Schützensteig panoramic tour

The newly created panoramic circular hiking trail on the Glungezer in the Hall-Wattens region has been accessible since the end of September 2023. The 4.5 km long trail, on which hikers overcome around 250 m of altitude up and downhill, runs at 2,100 m above sea level. Walking time is one and a half to two hours, depending on how quickly you can tear yourself away from the beautiful views of the valley and the Karwendel mountains.

Sunnenseite'n Trail

On the sunny slopes of the Stubai Valley, the new 7.5 km long Sunnenseite'n Weg leads along a forest path from Fulpmes to Neustift. Hikers cross a more than 100 m long suspension bridge on the way, which gives spectacular views of Neustift and the Stubai Glacier. Thanks to its sunny location at medium altitude, the Sunnenseite'n Weg (Sunny Side Trail) is accessible almost all year round.

Wipp Traverse

The Wipp Traverse leads in five daily stages from the Stubai Valley to South Tirol. What makes it unique: hikers spend the first five nights at the same hotel in the valley and can thus set off with a light daypack. The bus takes you to the starting point of the respective stage in the morning and back to the hotel in the evening. For the last night a stay in a hut at 1,900 m above sea level is planned. The stages are designed to cater for leisure hikers. The daily walking time is between four and six and a half hours.

Since summer 2023, the 3.4 km long Wäldetobelweg has been leading hikers on the trail of Klösterle's history. Eight stations provide insights into significant events such as the construction of the Arlberg Railway and the Wäldletobel bridge in the 19th century. From this summer, a quiz will further enhance the experience. Questions relate to the historical events and are aimed at children as well as adults.

Burgenland

Secrets in paradise

Since summer 2023, small groups of two to five people have been able to cycle their way around three- to four-hour adventure pleasure tours in Southern Burgenland. Similar to an escape room, there are puzzles to solve along the way. The tours have names such as "The Great Magician's Trial" or "On the Trail of the Archaeologist". The routes are mainly flat and between 23 and 29 km long. Depending on the tour, there are seven to ten stations. An e-bike rental service is available on site.

From May 2024, the new skill pump track at Panoramabeach Village will be adding to the action in Drobollach by Lake Faak. The track, which is suitable for beginners as well as advanced riders, can be used in all weathers thanks to its roof. Ride over waves and through steep curves by bike, scooter or skateboard. There are also some jumps to master.

Wine bike tour through Central Carinthia

Carinthian wines are still amongst the insider tips. If you would like to get to know some local wineries, you will be able to head for them by bike from spring 2024. The 52.5 km long wine bike tour is a circular route that leads from the train station in St. Veit to several wineries in Central Carinthia. Stops along the way include the Karnburg and Trippelburg wineries as well as Glanegg Castle with Lassnig wine tavern. Cycling time is just under four hours without breaks.

Donau-Veltliner wine cycle route

The new 46 km long Donau-Veltliner tour completes the range of Weinviertel wine cycle routes. The circuit leads from Langenzersdorf via Bisamberg, Korneuburg, Leobendorf, Harmannsdorf, Manhartsbrunn, Enzersfeld im Weinviertel, Hagenbrunn and Stammersdorf back to Langenzersdorf. The new wine cycle route is named after the Donau-Veltliner grape variety which is a new, fungus-resistant grape and white wine variety. The wine is a cross between Grüner Veltliner and Seyval Blanc. As a young wine it tastes fruity and as a mature wine it is very similar to the Grüner Veltliner.

Cycle around St. Pölten

St. Pölten, the capital of Lower Austria, impresses with a wide range of cultural events and architectural treasures. The spectrum spans from baroque to art nouveau and contemporary architecture. Since spring 2023, a package bookable via Mostviertel Tourism has been inviting visitors to explore the cultural highlights of the city and its surroundings by bike. In addition to three overnight stays with breakfast, the offer includes the Museum Card for five museums in St. Pölten, a trip on the Mariazell Railway and guided tours of nearby Herzogenburg Monastery and natural cosmetics manufacturer Styx. Rental bicycles and e-bikes are available at various "nextbike" stations across St. Pölten.

A cycling pilgrimage along the Sebaldus trails

Since summer 2023, there have been seven cycle routes that lead from Weyer or Gaflenz in a star shape through the countryside of the Kalkalpen National Park region. The routes are between 60 and 70 km long and run mainly along cycle paths, side roads with little traffic and well-developed freight roads. Their lengths and elevation gain are such that the day tours are easy to manage on e-bikes or trekking bikes.

Danube Limes World Heritage tour

The Marchkopf circuit

There is a new tour for road cyclists In the Zillertal. The 43.6 km long Marchkopf circuit leads across the Sidanjoch and the Zillertaler Höhenstraße. Cyclists must climb around 1,980 m on the challenging tour. Cycling time is about five and a half hours and ambitious bikers can extend to a mega loop that includes five passes across 76 km and 3,720 m of altitude.

Along the 6 km long hiking trail, 14 stations invite you to take a little break, meditate and relax amidst the trees. One of the stations is ideal for practicing yoga whilst another awaits you with a "treetop bed" from which you can observe the sky. A little waterfall also provides an energy boost along the way. Hikers should plan three and a half hours for the trail on which around 1,000 m of altitude have to be overcome, including breaks.

After several months of renovation, the National Park Worlds in Mittersill will reopen in May 2024 with upgraded existing attractions such as the 360-degree panorama cinema and the eagle flight panorama as well as modernised building systems and restaurant. Themed circular trail at Burgschrofen

From summer 2024, families will be able to dive into the legends, myths and stories of the village on a new, partly interactive themed circular trail in the protected landscape of Burgschrofen in Schwendau in the Zillertal. Six stations will tell tales about the devil, knights, a great treasure and people being forced into exile. 





A few years ago Gerda Rebitsch from Brixlegg in Tirol came up with a truly unique farm concept: to rent out chickens that provide fresh eggs. There are currently 180 hens living on her farm, including their fluffy offspring and 20 roosters. They include old breeds of chickens that are threatened with extinction. Those who rent a chicken from Gerda get a lot of eggs for 15 to 30 euros a month. Gerda also offers bees and ponies for rent. For her innovative farm concept, which is intended to bring consumers closer to the cycle of nature, Gerda received the silver medal at the Tirolean Innovation Awards 2019.
