With the Zillertal Superskipass, skiing and snowboarding lovers enjoy boundless freedom and variety on a whole 544 kilometres of pistes. Ultra modern cable cars, 180 in total, take guests quickly and carefree from the valley floor up to 1,600 metres in altitude. That's where the ski areas begin, as Zillertal just gets started where other resorts stop. And the experience on the slopes extends up to 3,250 metres, guaranteeing skiing in Zillertal.

On a ski safari with the Superskipass

Whether it's on wide carving slopes, adventurous family routes or long sporty downhill runs to the valley – everyone will find exactly what they are looking for here. The four large ski resorts Hochzillertal-Hochfügen-Spieljoch, Zillertal Arena, Mayrhofner Bergbahnen and Ski & Glacier World Zillertal 3000 always offer ideal conditions.

Simply stunning: the pleasurable circuit

On this day tour you cross no less than three ski resorts. It starts in Kaltenbach in the Hochzillertal ski area, continues through Hochfügen to Spieljoch and back again. This circuit, as the name suggests, is all about pleasure. In addition to fun on the slopes, excellent food awaits you at exclusive gourmet and traditional rustic huts and chilled lounges.



Pure fun and action: the Arena Tour

The "Arena Tour" is certainly an unforgettable adventure for the whole family. On the route there is lots of fun and action on offer with SkiMovie and Speed Check runs as well as snow parks with interactive points where action photos are taken. And the highlight at the end is Austria's longest downhill run: ten kilometres of pistes in one go down into the valley.

Don't miss: the new Wiesenalm. The architectural highlight right next to the Zillertal Arena downhill run to the valley offers delicious in-house creations, such as the "Wiesenfleck" and "Wiesenbier". Be sure to stop by and enjoy the view of the valley from the 180° panorama terrace.

Hungry for a challenge: the altitude-eating circuit

Action lovers who are all about challenge and speed will get their money's worth here. When it's time to head for the "Harakiri" downhill run on Mount Penken action mountain, your pulse will start racing: with a 78% gradient, it is the steepest experience on the slopes in Austria and therefore not for the faint-hearted. However, that is not the only record you will encounter on this tour: Austria's largest reversible aerial tramway ensures that you get to the top of Mount Ahorn effortlessly.

By the way: The Mayrhofner Bergbahnen cable car bottom stations are located right in the village. There's almost an urban skiing feel here.

Unique: the glacier circuit

This magnificent circuit leads through the Ski & Glacier World Zillertal 3000 from the Penkenjoch over sun-drenched slopes in the Rastkogel and Eggalm ski areas to the Hintertux Glacier. Even though it's magical, this tour requires a good level of fitness. Endurance winter sports enthusiasts cover 15,000 metres in altitude and 60 kilometres of downhill skiing from blue to black runs in one day. One of the undisputed highlights on the glacier circuit is the six-kilometre-long "Schwarze Pfanne" downhill run, which leads directly to the centre of Hintertux.

Did you know? The shuttle service that takes you to the glacier lift bottom station is included in the Superskipass!

Skiline - enter the code & download your sports performance

The Superskipass is not just your key to mountain happiness, it also records all the metres in altitude, kilometres of slopes and even speeds in some cases. This is activated automatically by the ski pass chip card. The altitude profile, including all lift rides, downhill runs and metres of altitude covered, can be easily accessed at skiline.cc/ by entering the ski pass number. Making the ski safari an unforgettable experience.
